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CASE I

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The patient, an elderly female, noted the onset of generalized seizures six years prior to death. Despite Dilantin therapy the seizures were poorly controlled and occurred on an average of once each week. She died at 74 years of age from causes unrelated to her central nervous system disorder.

At autopsy a tough, partly calcified, rounded mass 4 cm. in diameter was found attached to the dura of the right anterior temporal fossa.
